



OTTAWA COUNTY FAIR CAMPING RULES

We want you to enjoy your camping experience with us. Since we are a family campground, please follow all OCF camping rules. We would like to provide a safe environment for all.

- Please respect others camping around you and our neighbors.
- Camper must occupy the campground site assigned to him by the OCF representative.
- All campers must have at least 4 feet of clearance on all sides.
- Camp fires ONLY in approved fire pits provided by the Ottawa County Fair. No one is to climb on or move fire pits. Fires must be completely extinguished by 12:00 PM. No firewood is to be brought from outside of Park Township. Never leave any fire unattended.
- No dumping of grey water on ground! Campers, Trailers, and Motor homes which possess lavatories, sinks or toilet facilities must dispose of all waste at a Trailer Dump Station. (If you need sewage or gray water removed, please call for honey wagon service.)
- For your convenience the OCF has a dump station on site.
- No alcohol or controlled substances may be consumed on OCF property.
- Quiet hours are from 10:00 PM until 8:00 AM
- All extension cords must be 12-3 wire or better.
- Generators can only be used between the hours of 9:00 AM and 10:00 PM
- Visitors must be out of the campground by 10:00 PM
- Only one car per site. Any other vehicles may be parked in approved parking areas.
- Each site must have an adult at least 18 years of age. This person is responsible for all supervision of campers and guest on their site. No minors can be left unattended overnight.
- No pets during fair week
- Speed limit within the OCF grounds is 10 mph.
- Check out is at 12:30PM

Campers not following these rules will be subject to having their camper/trailer/motor home removed or towed at their own expense.

Camper will hold the Ottawa County Fair harmless for any damage sustained to their vehicle/camper/trailer/motor home while camping on Ottawa County Fair Grounds or if it is removed.

PENALTY

Violations of any of the Ottawa County Fair Rules and Regulations, including those listed above, may result in the revocation of the camping permit and/or eviction from the park. In addition, any person who violates any of the Park Rules and Regulations may be charged with a misdemeanor and, if convicted, may be fined not more than \$500.00, plus the costs of prosecution, imprisoned in the county jail for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both fined and imprisoned at the discretion of the Court.
